# CEMEX's NEW Plan to Restore its Rock Quarry to...

As you may have heard, <u>CEMEX</u> announced new changes to its currently approved reclamation plan, a plan that details how the Eliot facility's quarry operation will transition to a more natural state when the time comes for material excavation activities to wind down.

This plan, often referred to as a "Reclamation Plan," includes beneficial end uses such as pedestrian and bike trails, habitat restoration, agriculture, open space, and a new source of water. What's more, CEMEX can begin the process of restoring the property to a more natural state even as excavation is underway.

Among the major revisions is our decision to abandon plans to resume mining in Lake A. Our plan also calls for restoring the balance of the Eliot facility located between Stanley Boulevard and Isabel Avenue, including Lakes B and J.

While our plan has changed, our goal remains the same: To provide an affordable source of quality construction material for the region and, as the Eliot Facility is retired from operation, restore the property to beneficial uses that will support generations to come.
